

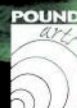

‘What’s the Matter?’ by The Last Baguette

A quantum comedy about love in the subatomic world

An unexplained cat theft from a physics laboratory leads scientist Smithy on a journey through his own experiment into the subatomic world. The situation becomes charged and it is impossible to stay neutral. Can he find the cat and win over his colleague Sarah in the process? Will the outcome be positive or negative?

A sci-fi adventure through the strange and wonderful world of quantum physics, featuring physical comedy, silly songs, dancing particles, and scientific slapstick. Be prepared for a very silly show about a very intelligent subject.

The show is 1 hr 10 minutes long and is performed by two actors and an overhead projector with original artwork, and is perfect for ages 8 to 108. This was followed in 2012 by **Dracula - l'humour plus fort que la mort**, a new adaptation of Bram Stoker's classic novel directed by Balthazar Gaulier.

Technical information

Running time: 1 hour 10 minutes without interval
Suggested age guidance: suitable for ages 8 to 108
Venue: can be performed in a theatre, community hall, lecture theatre or similar, if the space meets the following requirements
Minimum Stage Area: 6m width x 5m depth of clear, flat floor space - this can be raised or at ground level
Minimum height above the stage: 3m
Blackout: Near blackout required in the venue
Lighting / sound: Company can bring own equipment if needed
Audience configuration: standard end-on
Number on road: 2 performers plus 1 stage manager
Get-in time: 6 hours (less with pre-rig), get-out time: 1 hour
Parking: Required for 1 van and 1 car
