The Magic Fish was created in Spring/Summer 2016. It was commissioned by The Place, GemArts and Pavilion Dance South West. Research and Development was supported by The Unicorn Theatre. Supported using public funding by the National Lottery through Arts Council England.

Background

An initial R&D period of The Magic Fish was carried out in Spring 2016 as part of ATMA Dance's residency at The Unicorn Theatre, a leading children's venue. Scratch performances were presented for their UpClub Family Members, followed by performance workshops in London schools. These sharings and testing of the interactive elements of the piece with the children provided us with useful feedback and observations.

Further creative development time led to three test performance dates in different settings:

1. Previews in Poole Park as part of Pavilion Dance South West's *Discover, Play, Dream: Dance!* season of celebrating dance in everyday places.

2. Premiere of The Magic Fish at The Place's Robin Howard Dance Theatre following a one-week production week with lighting designed by Guy Hoare. These performances headlined their *Something Happening for Kids 2016 festival.*

3. Performances along the River Tyne as part of GemArts *Masala Festival.*

Audiences and Complementary Workshops

The Magic Fish is an interactive performance experience, using dance, music and storvtelling to engage and inspire young thinking minds. The show is designed to be performed in both indoor and outdoor settings. The show is suitable for both family and school groups, and attracts a culturally diverse audience. The performance is accompanied by high quality promotional print, images and film and can be supplemented with dance, visual art, craft and storytelling workshops.

Although the age guidance for The Magic Fish is 5-9 years, we know that the work has engaged under 5s too so are happy to deliver relaxed performances for children of all ages.

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Technical information On the Road: 4 people (3 cast, Technical Manager).

Duration: 45 minutes.

Performance times: Piece can be performed up to twice a day, with 1.5 - 2.5 hour break between performances.

Performance area: approx. 7m wide x 7m deep minimum.

Indoor performance requirements Get-in: one day before perf

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Flooring: black dance floor supplied by venue.

Seating: end on; if front row of raked seating can be removed then we like to encourage children to sit directly on floor mats close to the stage.

Two clean dressing rooms with iron and ironing board.

Outdoor performance requirements

Get-in: minimum three hours on performance site for sound-set up and sound check, spacing, setting props and organising seating.

4-6 speakers to play pre-recorded and live sounds, speaking and music.

Flooring: ideally solid staging with dance floor (provided by venue). *Please contact us to explore alternative suggestions, for instance the piece can be directly performed on grass.*

Seating: delineated seating area with mats or cushions for children to sit on with some seating behind for anyone unable to sit on the ground. Seating to be set in a semicircular configuration around the performance area.

Warm-up, dressing and rest room close to performance site with iron and ironing board.
