## MAKE YOUR OWN MAGIC

I know you loved to make exciting potions when you came to visit my museum, so I thought I would share some recipes with you. Now you can make them in your own houses, and impress your family & friends!

### Stinky Skunk Solution:

Extract of Skunk Odor has magical colour changing properties, but if you can't find any skunks, try this recipe. But do not drink the potions you make, they will not take very good at all!

Step 1: Blend two leaves of Red Cabbage with Water and strain to remove leftover pieces of leaf from the purple coloured water. Warning- Very Stinky!

Step 2: Pour some of your Purple Cabbage Juice into a clear cup.

Step 3: Try adding Vinegar or Bi-Carb Soda to your juice to see what colour it turns. What happens to your potion when you add both?

What other colours can you turn your potion?

Try adding lemon juice, cucumber juice, cola, or if you're allowed some shampoo!



### Bubbling Brew:

Combine these ingredients to make your own bubbling brew!  
But don't drink it! It definitely will not taste very nice!

Step 1: Add a small amount of Water to a clear cup and add a few drops of food colouring.

Step 2: Fill about 3/4 of the cup with Vegetable Oil.

Step 3: Drop a Dissolvable Vitamin Tablet or Aspirin Tablet into your potion, and wait for the bubbles to start! Watch as the coloured bubbles rise and fall in the oil.

### Slime Time:

This one takes a little preparation, but has a great, gooey result!  
Definitely DO NOT EAT!

Step 1: You need to purchase some Nappies.

Cut them in half, and scrape the powder in the lining into a cup or bowl.

Step 2: Take a cup of Water and add some fun food colouring

Step 3: Pour your coloured liquid into the powder, and wait 10 seconds.

Ta-Dah! You've now got slime!

When cleaning up, wash it down the sink with some salt to help it dissolve
