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Background

This project will see Trifle collaborate with performers and musicians from Kneehigh Theatre, Punchdrunk, Blackfish, Dogbite film, Pipeline Theatre, Wildworks, Falmouth University and the Hall for Cornwall.

Endless featuring *N:Dless* will investigate the different forms of anxiety through comedy. The story follows four friends whom in the 1990s had almost global fame with their electro/folk band named *N:Dless*.

This project has been in research and development for 12 months. Kyla and the company have been adopting the techniques of director Mike Leigh to discover the reality of the characters. It is through the authenticity of the characters that the humor has grown and flourished.

This R&D process has also allowed Trifle to explore the possibility of using the convention of 90s pop videos and music documentaries to tell the character's stories in a 'mockumentary style' implemented by Guest and Lilley in their films; Spinal Tap & Summer Heights High.

Trifle Gathering Productions are excited to announce their bravest project to date. *Endless featuring N:Dless* fuses film, live music, documentary and comedy into an epic tale of sex, drugs and anxiety disorders.

N:Dless' first album Fur Coats in the Desert sold over 100 copies in the midlands and they won Battle of the bands in Oakhampton 1991.

But all good things come to an end. Following an unexpected split back in 1998 fans and colleagues were left free falling, no explanation and so many unanswered questions... until now.

This show gives you a little peek into the extraordinary minds behind the award winning band *N:Dless*.



Key information for venues

- Endless has been in R&D for a year
- Trifle Gathering are interested in week-long runs if the opportunity arises
- Kyla, Endless' writer and director, has used the Mike Leigh process in developing the script
- Christopher Guest approach is also drawn upon throughout (i.e. script written and improvised by actors who have no rehearsal time)
- Happy to do workshops and post-show Q&As
- Press nights can be arranged if required
- Cast and creatives can be made available for interview and venue marketing efforts (agree beforehand)
- Funded by Arts Council England, FEAST and Cornwall Council and backed by Cultivator and Hall for Cornwall
- Trifle Gathering have a strong cast (the company hope to secure the same actors as used in the R&D process, listed at the start)
- Trifle Gathering have a loyal following of fans who are hungry to see more work
- Flyers and posters can be sent to the venue ahead of time, upon request

Technical and logistical information for venues

- Endless featuring N:Dless is approximately 2 hours long including a 20-minute interval
- Venue size would be ideally between 100 and 350 seats.
- Our get in time would be approximately 2pm for a 7.30pm start although we may wish for our technical team to set up from approximately 10am if possible.
- We will vacate the venue by 11pm on the night of the closing performance
- Required performance space, minimum 5m (w) x 4m (d) x 2.5m (h)
- We will be touring our own P.A., lighting rig and projector for venues where this cannot be provided.
- We will have a touring company technician and sound engineer
- We will require a minimum of 2 x 13-amp power outputs on separate circuits
- We need venues to either have/or provide a stage or raked seating
- In theatre and arts centres we will require access and technical support to the in house technical rig, which will include lights, sound and projection (if available). A plan will be sent prior to arrival.

- Original score produced by Justin Lee Radford and Vicki Abbot
- Features live music from the band as they go through the process of reforming
- Integrated, high production value film pieces throughout
- The concept is unique it is a documentary played out live on stage
- Observational comedy style which is familiar makes the piece accessible

Synopsis

Act 1

A fictitious film company present a documentary following the lives of the 4 members from a renowned 90's electronic fictitious band *N:Dless*. The band's story is revealed through blending historic pop videos, live music and documentary interviews.

Act 2

N:Dless reunite after a 12 year separation and attempt to bring the band back together for a final charity gig raising money for refugees. Struggles emerge as we discover the many anxiety disorders that each member have developed during and since the band. There are some devastating results and some simple realisations. Can the band really get back together?
