BIOGRAPHIES

Daniel Morden is one of the leading exponents in the art of storytelling. For 25 years he has delighted audiences all over the world with his performances including the Vancouver, Oslo and Yukon story telling festivals, The Hay, Beyond The Border, Bath and Cheltenham festivals and at venues such as The Barbican, The National Theatre and The British Museum. He has also worked on television and radio, has won awards and published books for both children and adults.

Sarah Moody is a multi instrumentalist who has worked for over ten years as a musician, music director and composer with theatre companies such as Kneehigh, Wildworks, London Bubble, Theatre Royal Bath and Travelling Light. She has co-founded a music project with children in Uganda and is presently researching alternative ways of introducing music to very young children.

Oliver Wilson-Dickson is well known as a fiddle player with the folk groups Jamie Smith's Mabon and ALAW. Described by R2 magazine as 'an expressive and exceptional fiddler' he also regularly collaborates with storyteller Daniel Morden. As a session musician, Oliver has contributed to many recordings from Cartoons for the BBC and a BAFTA award winning film soundtrack to CDs for Warner International. As a composer he has written music for stage productions and BBC Radio drama. He also plays in the house band on the Welsh TV show Noson Lawen. SHOW DETAILS

A full detailed spec is available on request.

Sound:

Where possible TDVC perform acoustically, otherwise the company will discuss the sound requirements for the show and the use of a PA.

Lighting:

The show has a simple lighting design with a full cue sheet.

Performance Space:

The performance space should be:

• A black box where possible;

• Minimum Performance Size – 4.5m depth x 3.5m width. In certain spaces an additional raised area (riser) at the back of the performance space may be appropriate;

• Chairs should be arranged in rows and, if appropriate, in a semi circle around the performance area, **not** in cabaret style with tables; and

• Any back drop or decoration needs to be minimal, plain and unobtrusive.

Additional Information

- Show Running Time 45 minutes, interval, 40 minutes (tbc)
- Merchandising: CDs and Books sold by performers after the show and during interval
- Get In Time: 4.5 hours prior to doors opening
- Get Out Time: 1 hour max
- Dressing Room: Please provide a secure area for performers to change in and leave personal belongings.
- Hospitality: Where possible the performers appreciate a <u>Vegetarian</u> meal at least 2 1/2 hours before the show starts as well as tea and coffee. Please also ensure that there is drinking water available in the dressing room/changing area.
- Crew Required: 1 to operate lights and sound
