

Set in a basement in Northern Iraq Bismillah! uses humour and compassion to approach an incredibly vital discussion around the experiences of disenfranchised young people in modern Britain.


This hilarious and heartbreaking production examines the impact of racial, social, economic and religious politics on youth in society. It's a show which tackles huge contemporary issues: from rising social tensions and the fall out of interventionist foreign policies to working in Wetherspoon's and the ever-rising price of a standard meal deal.

#### **About Bismillah!**

Initially developed by **Soho Theatre's** Young Writers Company *Bismillah!* was written in response to the targeted radicalisation by extremist groups of disenfranchised young people in Britain. The play tells of the encounter between a young British prisoner of war from Leeds and an London born young British Muslim boy who, who has defected to join the Islamic State.

The Edinburgh production in 2015 played to rave reviews, including **5 stars from Broadway Baby**. The show has subsequently enjoyed support and development from London's **Theatre Royal Stratford East** since the Edinburgh debut. It has also been the subject of discussion and praise at *Mock the Week – Comedy and the Politics of Representation*, an academic conference in 2016 hosted by Teeside University, at which writer Matthew Greenhough was invited to speak.

The new script, along with a new director, creative team and cast has recently finished at run at London's **VAULT Festival** where it sold out and was critically acclaimed including **4 stars from The Stage** and will be transferring to **The Pleasance**, **London** for 3 weeks in April 2018.

## Being part of a dialogue...

Performed by two actors, Wound Up Theatre have created an accessible script to discuss this complex issue - a story that at its heart is about two young men finding their place in the world. Writer Matthew Greenhough's quick witted script provides endless laughs and tears throughout.

The production has already been endorsed by **Dr. Anshuman A. Mondal** - Academic and author of '*Nationalism and Post-Colonial Identity*' and '*Young British Muslim Voices*', who has published widely on contemporary Muslim identities and cultures, nationalism, and multiculturalism. It has also enjoyed support from **Nihal Arthanayake of the BBC Asian Network**, and the **Active Change Foundation** - London's only youth charity which focus' on tackling radicalisation in disadvantaged communities.

Bismillah! examines themes of racism (specifically Islamaphobia), disenfranchisement, radicalisation and alienation in society, while promoting a powerful message of tolerance, compassion and multiculturalism. *Bismillah!* is an incredibly relevant and powerful piece of theatre which tackles prevalent but often undiscussed experiences of young people in Britain.

The productions uniquely comedic approach to the subject matter, fulfils the companies ambition of creating politically charged theatre which is accessible which encourages to discussion of otherwise uncomfortable subjects. *Bismillah!* aims to contribute to a dialogue on the wider social implications of the issues discussed in the play, encouraging audiences to politically engage with the themes of the shows – whilst approaching the subject neutrally and from a humanist standpoint.

Fundamentally, at its heart — the show is about youth in Britain and this production aims to connect to younger audiences in an accessible and informed way. In a 2014 report published by the United Nations they discussed the fact that **youth are 'particularly vulnerable to economic shocks, social instability, and conflicts"** and in this post 9/11, digitally savvy world, radicalisation is a hugely complex phenomenon. Feelings of vulnerability, otherness, alienation and expert grooming techniques has led to 800 Britons going to Syria from 2012-2016 to fight for or support ISIS and a further 600 caught trying to enter.



#### **The Production and Creators**

#### **Matthew Greenhough - Writer & Performer**

Writer Matthew Greenhough is an award-winning theatre maker, playwright, actor and comedian. *Bismillah!* is his second project produced by **Wound Up Theatre** and most recently his work *#Vile: The Untimely Demise of a Manufactured Pop Star* premiered at the **Edinburgh Fringe in 2017**. His Debut was 2013's *Delusions of Adequacy*.

As an Actor he has appeared in a number of high profile music videos and award winning short films and has won the **Dioiz**International Theatre Festival in Croatia for a devised piece: In Our Hands.



#### **Jonny Kelly - Director**

Jonny is a theatre director and dramaturg, who has been involved in the development of *Bismillah!* for over a year, after being introduced to the project by **Theatre Royal Stratford East**. As co-founder of **NorthSEE Theatre**, he has recently directed *Hyem* (Theatre503 and Northern Stage) and *The Passing Of The Third Floor Back* (Finborough Theatre). Other direction includes *A is for Ali* (Old Red Lion Theatre), *Money Womb* (Theatre503), *The Special Relationship* (Southwark Playhouse), *Boys Will Be Boys* (Soho Theatre), and *Call Centre* (New Wimbledon Theatre).

Associate and Assistant Direction includes assisting Justin Audibert on *Flare Path* (No. 1 National Tour) and Nina Raine on *Donkey Heart* (Trafalgar Studios). He was Assistant Director on both *The Hard Man* and *Unscorched* at the Finborough Theatre. He was also the resident assistant director of **Papatango Theatre Company**.

Upcoming shows include *A Princess Undone* at the **Park Theatre** in London, *Revolting Women* with **Mikron Theatre Company** and *She's leaving home* with NorthSEE (both national tours)

## Sofi Berenger - Producer

Sofi is an award-winning theatre and film producer from Melbourne, Australia. Starting her career in film production, Sofi produced a number of award-winning shorts and worked on projects for clients such as World Vision, TopShop, Live Nation, London ZSL Zoo, HSBC and Cornetto.

As an independent producer Sofi has worked in venues such as the Arcola Theatre, Arts Theatre, Jermyn St Theatre and St James' Theatre. Currently, she is the General Manager for **Iris Theatre** and won an **Off West End award** in 2017 for their production Treasure Island and her productions are nominated for a further 5x awards this year.

Sofi also produces London's Free Open Air Theatre Season at **The Scoop** and is currently working on a new double bill from **Giants Theatre** and producing for **Metal Rabbit** and **Monstro Theatre**.
