The Bear is directed by Emma Earle (Co-Artistic Director of Pins and Needles and Director of critically acclaimed immersive children's show Adventures In Wonderland) and Hal Chambers (Artistic Director of children's theatre company Tucked In). The set and costume design is by Zoe Squire (Co-Artistic Director of Pins and Needles). Following their successful collaboration on Father Christmas, Pins and Needles have again teamed up with Composer and Lyricist Lucy Rivers (Little Sure Shot).

The Bear is Produced by Pins and Needles Productions in association with Polka Theatre.

Pins and Needles thrive on creating new worlds and solving ambitious staging challenges. Their aim is to capture the imaginations of young audiences through magical, bold and inventive storytelling.
