Confetti

Felix is uptight and unlucky in love. He's the 'mate of honour' for his best friend's wedding, and it's going to be the best day EVER... as long as there aren't any distractions...

Confetti is a queer rom-com that follows event planner Felix from his friend's surprise hen party to wedding day, as he begins a secret tumultuous relationship which he must keep secret from the bride. As audiences arrive, they're welcomed as hen party guests & given goody bags containing tools to help create the magic of the show, including party hats (which they'll wear), glow sticks (for a nightclub scene), bubbles, sweets & party poppers. The interaction is fun & light hearted so audiences can get as involved as they want to.

The show is a celebration of the 'gay best friend' who's often side-lined in traditional rom-coms and gives him his own adventure. It's also a love letter to the hospitality sector, celebrating the places and things we used to love and feel safe doing before covid.



The journey so far...

Confetti was originally commissioned as a digital short for Attenborough Arts Centre in 2021. With funding and support from New Vic Theatre, NDT Broadgate and Arts Council England, Confetti went onto have an R & D in Winter '21 / Spring 22 with WIP shows at Assembly Venues as part of Coventry City of Culture, the New Vic Theatre and the Old Red Lion Theatre.

Confetti has since had a full month run at Assembly Venues Edinburgh Fringe where it received critical acclaim and has toured in 2022 to venues including the Marlowe Theatre, Waterside Arts and Unity Theatre Liverpoool as part of Homotopia Festival (The UK's Longest running Queer Arts Festival).

Confetti has good availability between July and October 2023 where it will be doing a larger tour, including a run at the Soho Theatre. We're also happy to discuss dates outside of this range.

Will is a Birmingham based writer and theatre maker. Will was named 'A Rising Comic Star' by Attitude Magazine for his solo show 'Yours Sincerely', which has toured across the UK to venues including Soho Theatre, Birmingham REP & Paines Plough's Roundabout. As a divisor and facilitator Will has worked with companies including Stan's Cafe, KIT Theatre & Told by an Idiot.

Will was one of the Bush Theatre's 'Six Emerging Writers' 2019/20 and is a BBC Arts New Creative. He is an Associate Artist of the National Youth Theatre of Great Britain and is the Artistic Director of Quick Duck Theatre. His radio play 'The Life & Works of Veronica St. Claude' staring Divina de Campo & Len Blanco will air on BBC Radio this year.

Hannah Birkin - Director

Hannah Birkin is a director from Derby, 'Confetti' is her professional directing debut. Other work for Quick Duck includes Assistant Directing 'Fashion Spies'. Hannah graduated from the University of Birmingham with a degree in English and Creative Writing. Outside of directing, she also works as a freelance reader and dramaturg and loves working with original comedy scripts. His work is featured on domestic & international TV/streaming services (BBC One, Netflix, Amazon Prime) and in film festivals across the world. He also scores, performs, and produces music for theatre (runs in London, Edinburgh, Birmingham), specialising in new writing and developing contemporary work. Tom is part of the BFI NETWORK X BAFTA Crew programme and is a Voting Member of PRS for Music.

Eleanor Rattenbury – Movement Director

Eleanor is a performer and choreographer specialising in musical theatre, physical comedy, and immersive and interactive performance. She is an experienced deviser and collaborative artist regularly working with companies in Birmingham. Eleanor has previously taken part in site-specific performances with movement company LYNNEBEC at The Lapworth Museum of Geology (Birmingham) and worked as movement director on Quick Duck Theatre's new work-in-progress, Confetti, which recently debuted at the Assembly Festival Gardens as part of Coventry City of Culture. As a facilitator Eleanor uses a variety of stimuli and brings a positive, open energy into a space to encourage participants to discover how their body likes to move and how it can be used as a tool for communication and expression.














Chaz Webb – Stage Manager
